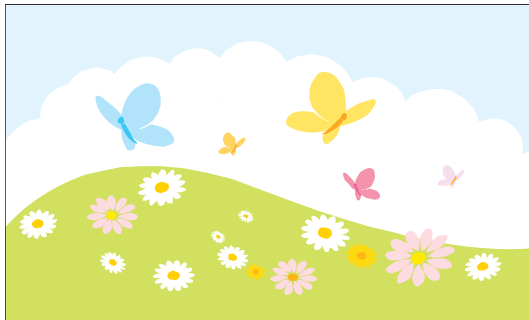

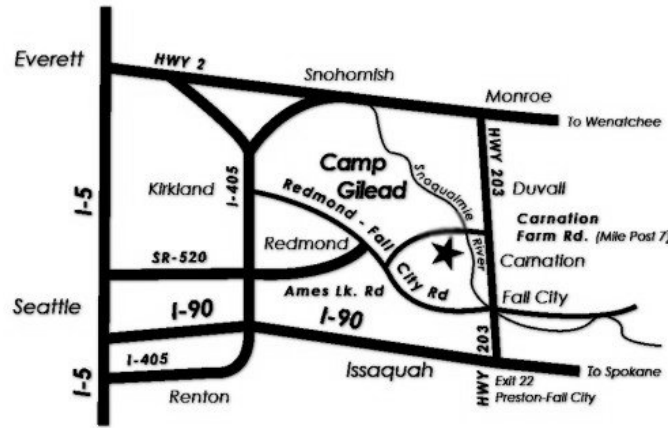

Meet the Speaker: Ruthanne Beddoe

I was raised in Bellevue, WA by Pastor and Mrs. John Ruhlman. One of my earliest, and happiest, memories is walking down the block to the Bellevue Public Library, housed at that time in the Boys Club building. Our home was always full of books and we read them—a lot!

After graduating from Sammamish H.S., I attended Western Baptist College in El Cerrito, CA. Following my freshman year, Darrell and I were married, and I completed my BA in English at Los Angeles Baptist College, while he earned his M.Div. at the seminary there. God placed us in pastoral ministry, first at Emmanuel Baptist in Snohomish, and then at Whitney Baptist in Boise. As each of our four children were growing up, we enjoyed stories—telling them, writing them, and reading them—together. After they grew up and began to leave home, I went back to college and earned my teaching credential and masters degree at Boise State University. I taught freshman English at West Jr. High in Boise for 15 years before moving to Bremerton in 2006 so we could better serve the churches of the Baptist Network Northwest, of which Darrell is the director. I have been teaching American and World Literature to juniors and seniors at King’s West H.S. in Bremerton, as well as concurrent English classes there as an adjunct professor of Central Washington University.

One of my great joys is watching the light come on in a young person’s eyes when he or she “gets it” when reading or writing. It is especially exciting to see how God enlightens minds when people consider literature through a Christian worldview.
