
Hidden Bucky



Later I drove to Washington for Raunwyn and Andy Cotogna-Denney's wedding, my good friends who have both served on staff. I stayed at camp that weekend and I was able to speak with Kimberly the next morning about the job. Something about being at camp, celebrating the wedding of two camp staff alumni, and seeing other camp friends reminded me of how much I loved Gilead. About a week later, the Lord made my choice clear, and I said yes to working at camp. I grew up going to Camp Gilead every summer, and I wanted to be on staff as soon as I could. What is it like living at Camp Gilead? Well, the past two months have been an adventure in the best way. The CCCA Northwest Hospitality and Marketing Advance at Shiloh Bible Camp was another opportunity I had to learn about these aspects of camp ministry. Some highlights were spending time with Sophie Lembke (a Gilead staff alumna who now serves at Dunes Bible Camp), brainstorming social media strategies with other camp staff involved with marketing, and spending time in God's creation. I have also been able to visit Black Lake Bible Camp in Olympia, and Dunes Bible Camp near Long Beach. It was fascinating to get a tour of each camp and gather new ideas that could be implemented at Camp Gilead.

After two months, I am still so thankful to be here. I had imagined what camp may have looked like during the year, but I never anticipated everything involved with serving at Camp Gilead outside of the summer and how enjoyable it is. As someone who always had to drive a few hours to camp, I have loved spending so much time with friends that I usually would only see during the summer. Movie nights in the lodge, Friendsgiving with local staff alumni, and a weekly Bible study are just a few memories I have enjoyed recently with my new community. It is such a privilege to be in this position at Camp Gilead and the Lord is continuing to teach me to depend on Him completely.

FROM THE CAMP KITCHEN:

Ranch Dressing Recipe





This ranch dressing is something that we make at home all the time, and my family really loves it! It comes from the Trim Healthy Mama Cookbook, and I like the fact that it doesn't have any sugar and it is gluten free. It can be modified to be dairy free, if you use dairy free yogurt, but I haven't tried it yet.

It starts out with a seasoning mix:

3 tbsp. Garlic Powder

6 tbsp. Dried Parsley

3 tbsp. Dried Minced Onion

3 tbsp. Salt

3/4 tsp. Black Pepper



Combine in a blender and blend until well mixed. Store in an airtight jar.

To make the dressing/dip:

Add 1 Tablespoon of the ranch mix to:

3/4 C. Mayo

1/2 C. Plain Greek Yogurt

Mix well. Let it sit in the fridge for a bit before serving.



It will end up being pretty thick as it sits, so if you want to use it as a dressing add a little bit of water. We mainly use it as a dip, so we like it just as it is.

WOMEN'S RETREAT March 17-18


