The Mailloux family has been going to Camp Gilead since 1995. We were just starting to have kids and living in Tacoma at the time, so the 50-minute drive was easy. Cathy Kilmer attended Southside Baptist Church with us, and she showed us a VHS video of some of the crazy fun activities at Camp Gilead. One activity was pushing a VW Bug around the old tree by the swings (no longer there), down into the soccer bowl and across the finish line. We had to check Camp Gilead out for ourselves... and we've been coming ever since.

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Camp Gilead is the safest place I know for kids. You would think that the raging Snoqualmie River, the thick forest next to the camp property, the potential for wild elk, deer and bear to wander onto camp, BB guns, slingshots, canoes, dirtboards, and a swimming pool would make camp a dangerous place for kids, but in the 28 years we have been bringing our kids to Camp Gilead, we have never worried that our kids were unsafe or not well-looked after by the staff. The staff, counselors and programming make fun-filled days go by fast to keep the kids engaged and not even missing their electronics!

In 2005, Kimberly asked me to come and speak to the high school and college staff during staff training week. We have lived in eastern Washington for over 20 years, but we still travel the 3½ hours to Carnation and have been coming to staff training and staying for Family Camp every year. Our family wouldn't know what to do if our summer plans didn't include as much time as possible at Camp Gilead. In fact, this summer (2023), we came back for a week of resident camp. I spoke in chapel, 3 of my older kids were on staff, 3 were resident campers and stayed in cabins, and our youngest went to Day Camp. It was the best week of our summer!

The Bible talks about a place called Gilead, east of the Jordan River, known for the medicinal qualities of an ointment made from a plant that grew in the rocky region. This balm was sought after throughout the known world and is described in Genesis 37:25 as a commodity traded by caravan with Egypt some 280 miles away. Later, in Jeremiah, during a time when Israel was being judged for her disobedience against God, the prophet asks, "Is there no balm in Gilead? Is there no physician there?" I can fully attest, along with my wife and ten kids that there truly is a Balm in Gilead. His name is Jesus, and He will bring healing and rest to your body, soul, mind and heart. Let's all be grateful for the way God brought the great blessing of Camp Gilead into our lives.



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
